From the Leadership

In Northwest Indiana, almost one in three households can't afford basic needs such as childcare, housing, food, transportation, and healthcare. Half of Americans report that they live paycheck to paycheck. We receive approximately 1,000 phone calls from neighbors requesting emergency help every year. And we know that such a call can be the tip of an iceberg. Some of our community's challenges run deep. There are urgent needs, and there are root causes below them.

In our 2023-2025 Strategic Plan, we aim to reduce the number of Northwest Indiana households living below financial sustainability levels by producing 1,000 graduates through the Level Up program. We also aim to guide at least 3,500 community members to the immediate help they need by creating a one-on-one case management and referral service. We continue our partnership and collaboration throughout the Region. We aim to grow our capacity to match the needs of our citizens.

We recognize that we are a steward of our Region's trust and financial support. The 2023-2025 Strategic Plan is the culmination of a region-wide listening campaign, a deep data dive, and innovative problemsolving informed by many voices. We want to use our resources to help people when they need help and tackle root causes to build up lives and livelihoods.

We believe everyone in Northwest Indiana deserves the right to thrive. Our new bold plan harnesses the power of caring to make every life in Northwest Indiana better-today and tomorrow. 
